COUNSELING PROGRAM

The Parkview School District shall maintain a school-counseling program in which students are systematically, actively and purposely assisted in acquiring personal human skills.

The program is comprehensive in scope and modeled after the Wisconsin Model Academic Standards for School Counseling, which focuses on three domains: academic, emotional and personal/social.

The specific components of the school-counseling program include:

- A program that reaches every student
- Is designed to be preventative
- Developmental in nature
- Integral part of the total educational system

- Program management and operation
