

# SUMMER SCHOOL 2011-2012

## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR Jr/Sr HIGH SCHOOL

### PROGRAM LOCATION

All high school courses will be held at Parkview High School unless an instructor designates that the course will be held at another site. If a course site is changed the instructor will notify all course participants.

**DATES** – June 18 through July 13, 2012, unless otherwise noted. There will be no classes on Wednesday July 4<sup>th</sup>.

### TUITION

Any student seeking entrance into the Parkview School District Summer School program must reside within the established boundaries of the district. The child's parent or legal guardian must reside within Parkview School District boundaries. Non-resident students will be charged tuition in accordance with state tuition law (121.77). Non-resident students who have applied to the Board of Education by April 2012 for the Public School Open Enrollment Program, and have been approved to enroll for the 2012-2013 school year may be waived tuition for summer school enrollment.

### DAILY SCHEDULE

Time and length of classes at Parkview High School will vary. The number of weeks for each course is outlined in the course description booklet. Credit Recovery Schedule and expectations are attached.

### TRANSPORTATION

Student transportation to and from summer school will be a parent responsibility. Periodically students in some of the summer school courses will be taking field trips.

### REGISTRATION

A summer school program enrollment form is included with this packet. **All enrollments for elective courses must be returned to the high school office by June 1, 2012.** Any high school student who desires to enroll in the summer school program after June 1, 2012 may enroll where there are still openings. It is imperative all students enroll by this date since courses are scheduled or dropped based on enrollments and the availability of qualified instructors as of this date. As a general rule courses with an enrollment of fewer than 12 students will be cancelled. Any student who does not attend Parkview schools during the regular year must have a completed emergency form attached to their enrollment form so that school personnel can properly handle any emergency.

### FEES

There will be student fees charged to cover specific costs. Charges for materials fees are listed in this booklet with the course descriptions. Teachers will collect these fees on the first day of class. Please send a check payable to Parkview School District for the required amount. Credit recovery courses do not require a fee

## **REGULATIONS**

**Attendance**-All enrolled students are expected to attend summer school on a regular basis. Students may be excused for the following: family vacations, summer camps or clinics, illness, family emergency or absences approved by the summer school principal. However, students taking classes for credit will be expected to meet the attendance requirements of those particular classes. Because credit is given for those classes, attendance requirements are higher. A student will be dropped from a credit class on the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) absence. Fees will not be refunded if a student drops a class or is withdrawn for attendance or disciplinary reasons. Parents must notify the appropriate building office and/or teachers if a student is to be absent.

**Dress** – Regular school year rules will be followed during the summer program.

**Arrival** – Prior to class time teachers will be busy with class preparations so student arrival should be timed accordingly.

**Dismissal** -Students will be expected to go home when their instructional sessions end. If students attend only one or two course sessions, they will not be allowed to wait a long period of time for rides or to wait for other students who are still involved in instructional activities.

## **INDIVIDUAL STUDENT COURSE SCHEDULES**

Individual student course schedules for elective courses will be given to the students the week of June 1. Credit recovery courses, schedules, and instructor names will be sent the week of June 13<sup>th</sup> once all grades have been posted for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester classes.

## **COURSE CHANGES**

Program course changes are discouraged since teachers are hired and classes are scheduled based on course requests. Some classes are scheduled with minimal enrollment with the expectation that all students will remain in the classes.

## **SUMMER SCHOOL STAFF**

Certified teachers will teach all summer school programs. Efforts will be made to keep pupil-teacher ratios at a level that fosters opportunities for maximum pupil-teacher instructional interaction. When appropriate, qualified teacher aides will be hired to assist the professional staff.

# SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES

\*All grade level designations are based upon student's present (2011- 2012) grade in school.

## CREDIT RECOVERY

Required for students grades 9-12 who have failed a semester or more of a required course.

Course Cost: none

Location: Computer lab E (Enter Junior High entrance)

Instructor: Brenda Treat (English/Social Studies) Mary Stelter (Social Studies/Science/Math/JH Remedial)

Dates: June 18-July 13, Mon.-Fri. Students will be assigned two hour blocks of time per course taken. 7:30 – 9:30am, 10:00 – 12:00am, lunch break (none will be served at school), 12:00 – 2:00pm, 2:00 - 4:00pm.

Students will begin with one course assigned during a two hour block. Below are the criteria for summer school. If the student does not complete the course(s) they will continue credit recovery in the fall in the learning lab.

Criteria for summer school courses:

1. Student will be removed from summer school after 3 absences and no credit given.
2. Student must complete given assignments at the minimum of 75% accuracy before moving on to the next assignment/unit.
3. Students may be given additional assignments to improve academic proficiency at the discretion of the instructor.
4. Students who are not compliant with summer school expectations will be removed and no credit given.
5. **Junior High students** in jeopardy of retention will be contacted about what summer school courses need to be completed to in order be promoted. Parents will receive a specific schedule after the school year ends the week of June 13<sup>th</sup>.

## **STRENGTH & CONDITIONING**

Gr. 6-11

Course Costs: None

Dates: Beginning June 11 – Aug. 3 hours will be arranged with the instructor on the first day. Students will be expected to commit to one of the following time slots 6:30-8:30 a.m., 9:00-11:00 a.m., 12:00-2:00 p.m., or 2:30-4:30 p.m. (Approx. 8-10 hours per week for 8 weeks).

Are you interested in getting bigger, faster and stronger? Then this class is for you. Whether you are planning to play sports or are concerned about your health and wellness, you belong in this class. Students will utilize weight training, plyometrics, speed and agility training to improve their overall health, strength, flexibility and endurance. Students who complete this course and follow the program will notice significant improvements in their overall athletic ability.

If a student does not complete the work necessary for credit, the student will finish the course in a learning lab the fall of 2012.
