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Looking Down the Road

A few weeks ago (March 13) marked the one year anniversary since COVID-19 shut down Parkview in-person instruction for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year. While it would be easy to look at this anniversary with negativity, I strive to be a glass half full kind of guy. As a result, I look at the one year COVID-19 anniversary in a positive light. For example, as of April 1 Parkview completed 124

days of the 2020-21 school year. The positivity comes from our District successfully having in-person instruction for 114 of the 124 days at PJH/HS and 119 out of 124 at PES. In a normal year, this might not seem like a big deal, but this high degree of in-person instruction comes on the heels of many surrounding districts just now returning to inperson instruction for the first time for the 2020-21 school year. Additionally, Parkview just finished winter sports and the high school volleyball and football seasons are about to begin. Plans are in motion, with appropriate safety precautions in place, to have a homecoming parade, prom, spring Pizazz show, graduation ceremony and summer school. Over 85% of Parkview staff have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine which should prevent any further staffing issues that could cause instruction to pivot to full virtual. During the month of April, our students in grades 3-8 and 10 will complete the WI Dept. of Instructional staff to excel on these assessments. All in all, the Parkview community navigated this pandemic quite well.

Projecting ahead to the 2021-22 school year, it looks much brighter than it did a year ago. While a lot of things can change between April and the start of the next school year, I assure you that the Parkview administration is planning to begin the school year on Sept. 1 with full in-person instruction. Plans are also in the works to resume extra and cocurricular activities at PES, PJH and PHS.

It is likely that face coverings, social distancing, frequent hand-washing and visitor restrictions will still be in place for the start of the 2021-22 school year, but as we have shown this year, nothing can slow down #ParkviewCrew! Guy Stricker's Two Cents About The Winter Season

The fact that our boys and girls basketball teams, as well as our wrestling team had full seasons this winter is an accomplishment in itself. With a global pandemic and all that has gone with it, playing any sports, let alone two sports that involve such close contact, seemed like a pipe dream. Not only did we complete our seasons, we had some pretty remarkable milestones that were reached along the way.

Boys Basketball: The boys were a high scoring team all season. They won a regional matchup before finally losing to the #1 ranked team in the state, Cuba City. The boys were led by a strong senior group that saw Tyler Oswald and Connor Simonson awarded 1st team all-conference. Another milestone this year was Tyler Oswald becoming the 8th player overall and the fourth boys player to reach 1,000 points for his career. Tyler didn't play at Parkview as a freshman, and had less than 60 points as a sophomore, so he reached this milestone in two years of basketball. Great job boys.

Girls Basketball: The girls finished their season with a loss in regional play, to a very tough Deerfield squad. Junior Jenna Olin led the girls in post season awards by being named the Player of the Year in the Trailways Conference. Calley Burrell and Sidda Meyers were both given All-Conference honorable mention honors. Kudos to all the girls.

Wrestling: The wrestling team had a tremendous season. The season was

capped by sending, a school record of three wrestlers to the WIAA State Wrestling Meet. Korben Brown, Wyatt Egan, and Luke Schwengels all qualified for the state meet. Korben Brown also reached a milestone with his 100th win of his career. Korben was a three time qualifier for the state meet. Also, Korben Brown and Lexi Martin were named male and female wrestlers of the year, respectively, in the Trailways Conference. Great job to all of our wrestlers. Spirit Squad: The Spirit squad got a later start to their season, but they came to our home basketball games and really did a great job of cheering for our teams. Having them present at our games gave another piece of normalcy to this "not normal" season.

Parkview FFA members participate in a wide range of activities ranging from leadership development events (public speaking), career development events (judging teams), exhibiting at the Rock County and Wisconsin State fair, leadership workshops, state and national conventions, community service projects, FFA State Honors Band and Choir, and completing Supervised Agricultural Experience Projects.

FFA Members are among the most active students at Parkview High School. Members can choose for themselves how active they wish to be in the organization. No student does every activity in the FFA - there are simply too many! Rather, students are encouraged to explore their own personal interests within the FFA. Some students may have an interest in more traditional activities in the FFA, such as showing at the county fair. Others may be more interested in the scientific side of the FFA and may choose to conduct research using the department facilities such as an independent study in the greenhouse. Some students join FFA to travel to conferences, workshops, and conventions all across the state and nation. Students may want to take part in a public speaking competition or meet new friends on a field trip or social event such as pumpkin bowling, bingo night, or the meeting on the farm.
