## **State Assessments Even More Important in 2021**

With the exception of the 2019-20 school year (canceled due to COVID-19 school closure), Parkview students in grades 3-11 annually complete a series of state mandated assessments to determine the effectiveness of Parkview's curriculum and instruction on raising student achievement.

Students in grades 3-8 and 10 take the WI Forward exam. Grade 10 also takes the ACT Aspire exam. Grade 9 takes the ACT Aspire exam and grade 11 takes the ACT with writing exam. These exams provide students, staff and parents with important information about how effective Parkview is with raising the level of student achievement. Annually, the staff reviews and analyzes the test results to identify areas of improvement, and revisions are made to improve student achievement the following year. I firmly believe that Parkview's steady improvement in student achievement is a result of improvements made based on these assessments.


Parkview students didn't take these tests during the 2019-20 school year and Parkview's instructional delivery during the last year has included a large amount of virtual instruction so the 2020-21 assessment data is even more important than during a non-pandemic year.

Within the next month, Parkview will be communicating the assessment dates for each grade. I ask that parents do their best to ensure their kids, if healthy, are at school for each of these assessments. Getting accurate assessment scores from all students ensures that Parkview staff will be able to continue improving and increasing the quality of learning for all students.

# **Enrollment Increase**

## Positive trend for Parkview's enrollment

We are incredibly thankful that the Parkview School district has been able to keep its doors open to its students and staff through these trying times. We are one of the only districts in the state-line area that have been engaging in face to face instruction full time for the 2020-21 school year. With that said, our enrollment has increased 8.5% since last school year, and 12.9% since 2017. Impressively, we have gained 31 new resident students since September. The efforts of our staff and district families are no doubt the reason for this success!
