### Parkview Open Enrollment for 2022-23 Shows Positive Growth

Parkview's enrollment continues to move in a positive direction and this has a lot to do with Parkview's open enrollment. Parkview's enrollment grew by 26 students since 2016-17.

The positive movement in enrollment has a lot to do with the quality of education and extracurricular activities offered in the District. Parkview has been increasing the rigor of our courses and providing a wider variety of learning opportunities in the form of Advanced Placement (AP classes) and dual-enrollment classes. Dual-enrollment classes allow students to earn college credit for classes they complete at Parkview. Parkview is also expanding our Career & Technical Education and Fine Arts programs. Parkview continues to grow our clubs and extracurricular activities. Parkview offers many programs such as show choir, FFA, trapshooting and equestrian. Parkview also provides more traditional sports such as football, volleyball, cross country, wrestling, basketball, spirit squad, golf, track and field, softball and baseball. We also coop hockey with Stoughton for our girls and Beloit Memorial for our boys.

The Dept. of Public Instruction (DPI) annually evaluates the enrollment of every public school district in Wisconsin on the third Friday in September and a portion of Parkview's State funding is based on this enrollment count.

The 2022-23 open enroll in and out applications for Parkview show positive growth. Parkview received 31 applications for students to enroll into the District. None of the 31 applicants currently attend Parkview. The District received nine (9) applications for students that want to enroll out of the District. Of the nine (9), only three (3) currently attend Parkview. Five of the nine would be enrolling in 4K for the first time and the other student is moving to the District and choosing to stay in their current school. Now a lot can happen between June and the first day of school, but these figures show a positive open enrollment of +22 students.

# Youth Apprenticeship

## Providing Real World Experience

Youth Apprenticeship provides junior and senior high school students an opportunity to explore their career interests while earning high school credit through a structured mentorship program and aligned coursework. Youth Apprenticeship programs are available in 11 diverse occupational areas including, Agriculture, Forestry, & Natural Resources, Architecture & Construction, Arts, A/V Tech & Communications, Finance, Health Sciences, Hospitality, Lodging, & Tourism, Information Technology, Manufacturing, Marketing, Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math, and Transportation, Distribution & Logistics

To receive their certificate students had to complete a minimum of 450 hours of on the job mentorship, display their development of career specific skills and complete aligned coursework. The following students will graduate high school with marketable skills, career related work experience and confidence in their post-secondary decision making.

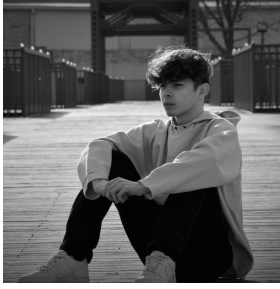
### You Can Enroll Your Baby!

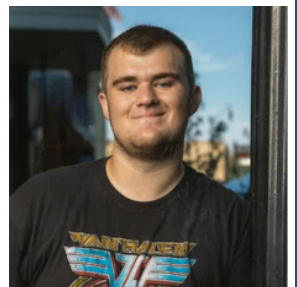
