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Parkview Community Survey, Possible Referendum & Recent Newspaper Articles

The Beloit Daily News and the Janesville Gazette published articles in their Wednesday, July 27 publication that don't provide a full picture of Parkview's recent Community Survey. The articles were in relation to an interview Superintendent Lutzke did with reporter Sara Meyers regarding a community survey Parkview distributed to gauge support for a potential operational and facility referendum. At Meyer's request, Superintendent Lutzke shared the survey results which makes it all the more confusing as to how she arrived at the title and some of the content for the articles.

The Beloit Daily News article was titled, "Parkview School District surveys shows not enough support for a capital referendum." To the contrary, the survey showed 60.3% support for a facility referendum of \$15.4 million or less. Sixty percent support is a strong majority. Ms. Meyers has the survey data and Superintendent Lutzke verbally communicated these results.

The Gazette article on the same topic, also written by Meyers was titled "Parkview School District survey shows support for operating referendum". The community survey does show support for an operational referendum as 54.4% responded in the affirmative.

Interestingly, the survey question for a facility referendum of \$15.4 million or less showed a higher level of support than the operational referendum question, but the Daily News chose a title that stated "shows not enough support for a capital referendum."

To be sure, one of the Parkview survey questions asked if the respondent would support a \$27.8 million facility referendum. The results did not show support for a facility referendum of this size. To reiterate, the survey did show 60.3% support for a facility referendum of \$15.4 million or less.

In the Gazette article, reporter Meyers quoted Superintendent Lutzke as saying, "A capital referendum that would focus on renovations or improvements or additions to buildings is not being considered at this time, Lutzke said."

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Letter from District Administrator

This statement is not accurate and may mislead people that the Board is not considering a facility referendum. At the end of the article, Meyers also quoted Superintendent Lutzke as saying, "Lutzke said the district is now working with consultant Nexus Solutions to determine its next steps." This quote is accurate as the Board and administration have been working with NEXUS for over a year and will be making a decision in the near future regarding an operational and facility referendum.

The Parkview Board and Administration have given significant weight to the survey data to guide its decision making as it relates to a potential operational and facility referendum. The data collected shows support for both questions and the Board will be taking action at the August 15 meeting in regard to these important questions. 
