

Update on School Closure

On Thursday, April 16, Governor Evers ordered all schools to remain closed for the rest of the school year. This news saddened me, but it is probably the right call. Trying to bring a large number of students and adults into the confines of a school building would probably result in someone transmitting COVID-19 to multiple people. As a result of the Governor's order, the school administration and Board developed a plan for the rest of the school year.

The plan for the rest of the year is as follows:

- 1. Virtual Instruction will continue through Friday, June 5. Last day for seniors is Friday, May 29. Students are required to participate in the instruction just as if they were attending school in the school building.
- 2. During the week of June 1, parents/students will be required to return the District iPad/Chromebook, cord, charger and Wi-Fi hotspot, cord and charger in the box (if provided by the District) and library books, classroom reading books and any other supplies that were sent home in March. We will follow curbside drop off. Continued on page 2

April 7 Parkview Referendum Successful

I'm happy to report the Parkview School District referendum that was on the April 7 ballot was successful. The results included 1009 Yes votes and 848 No votes. The District is appreciative of all those that went to the polls and especially those who voted in support!

This was a good day for Parkview students, staff, parents, and community, as the successful referendum will address real budget issues within the District. Additionally, the approved referendum will not increase the school tax rate.

The referendum will address non-recurring expenses consisting of technology and curriculum materials, classroom materials, new academic programming, additional bus routes and cost for recruiting and retaining quality staff.

Parkview is facing a \$921,000 shortfall for the 2020-21 school year and it grows larger in future years. Because of the community support shown on the referendum, the District will continue to grow the success of our students! #ParkviewCrew! Go Vikings!

5. NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

During this Board meeting, the Board will hold a public hearing, pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 118.38(1)(b), to take comments from the public pertaining to the Board's plan to ask the Department of Public Instruction for a waiver of the number of required instructional hours for the 2019-2020 school year.

Superintendent Steve Lutzke explained the rationale for requesting a waiver for meeting the WI DPI instructional hours requirement due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Lutzke also requested approval of a

waiver to be released from the WI DPI Educator Effectiveness requirements for 2019-20 also due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Superintendent Lutzke explained that with providing virtual instruction each day it was likely Parkview would still meet the minimum required hours of instruction but the waiver was insurance in case the District did not meet the standard. Lutzke explained that the same was true of the Educator Effectiveness requirements. The administrative team felt it was likely they would meet a vast majority of the Educator Effectiveness requirements, but the waiver would be insurance in case the administrative team was unable to meet the requirements. Discussion followed the explanation.

Superintendent Lutzke explained the revisions to policy 151 were necessary to allow the Board to present and approve a new policy at a single meeting. Discussion followed.

Motion by Jennie Krajeck, Second by Don Bomkamp, to approve the revisions to Policy 151. All in favor, none opposed. Motion carried 6-0

7.2 Discuss/Action Regarding Policy to Allow Board Members to Participate Remotely in Board/Committee meetings. Steve Lutzke explained the components of the proposed new policy 186 which would allow a Board member to participate in a meeting remotely. The Board discussed several components in the draft and made several revisions. Discussion followed. Motion by Zach Knutson, Second by Don Bomkamp, to approve new policy 186 to allow a Board member to participate in a Board/Committee meeting remotely and to waive Item #4 during the WI declared COVID-19 emergency. The motion also revised Item #4 to read, "No Board member shall participate remotely in a regular Board meeting more than two (2) times during a calendar year. This two (2) meeting limit does not apply to committee meetings. However, the Board, by majority vote, shall allow a Board member to participate remotely more than two (2) times when conditions or circumstances justify such added remote participation."

The motion also included removing the word "Pandemic" from 2(e), and adding to Item #9

"Remote participation is also not allowed to vote on items discussed during closed session." All in favor, none opposed. Motion carried 6-0

The Board will convene into closed session under Wisconsin State Statute 19.85(1)(c) for the purpose of considering employment, promotion, compensation or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction (classified employees and coaches), 19.85(1)(e) for deliberating about a contract (Kobussen) and 19.85(1)(f) for the purpose of approving previous closed session minutes. Motion to convene into closed session was made by Don Bomkamp at 6:48 pm. and seconded by Jennie Krajeck. Roll call vote: Knutson-Yes, Krajeck-Yes, Bomkamp-Yes, Suiter-Meyers-Yes, Myhre-Yes, Hammes-Yes. Motion passed 6-0. Closed session began at 6:48 pm. A motion to return to open session was made at 7:15 pm by Zach Knutson and seconded by Jennie Krajeck. All in favor, none opposed. Motion carried 6-0

Parkview 1st graders are busy learning online and having a lot of success. We use a variety of tools and virtual instruction methods to stay connected to our families.

For example, we use Class Dojo with our families, and it is a great way to stay connected. Class Dojo is a communication app used to connect families with school. Teachers and students share photos, videos, and messages between home and school. Students sign into their iPads daily and work through their assigned lessons. Their lessons cover the skills that students would have learned in the traditional classroom.



8.1 Discuss/Action on English Language Teacher Proposal: The ELL (English Language Learning) program population is growing at Parkview, and it has been determined that another teacher is required at the PES level to better assist the students we have needing this instruction. PES Math Interventionist Ms. Robin Nelson is interested and available to fill this position, but requires some additional education to obtain the proper licensure. The proposal would allow Ms. Nelson to pursue this education with the District covering the tuition cost of \$6,200.00. If Ms. Nelson leaves the District prior to the 2021-22 school year, she would be required to reimburse the District for the full cost of the tuition. Ms. Nelson would have to reimburse the District \$5,000 if she left in 2022-23, \$4,000 if she left on 2023 -24, \$3,000 if she left in 2024-25, \$2,000 if she left in 2025-26 and \$1,000 if she left in 2026-27.
