When should my sick child or other family members stay home?

If anyone in the house has:

- Cough
- · Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste
- New loss of smell



At least two of the following:

- Fever
- Chills
- Body aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Fatique
- Nausea or vomiting
- Congestion or runny nose
- Diarrhea



All siblings and household contacts of sick child should not come to school until contact is made with the school nurse.

When can we return to school and work?

The sick individual...

Is diagnosed with a different illness

Tests negative for COVID-19

Tests positive for COVID-19

Does not get COVID-19 test and does not have a medical diagnosis of different illness

Sick Person

Follow guidance from medical provider

24 hours symptom free without using medication

10 days after symptoms started AND fever free for 24 hours with other symptoms improving

10 days after symptoms started <u>AND</u> fever free for 24 hours with other symptoms improving

Household Members

All well individuals may return to school & work

All well individuals may return to school & work

10 days after last contact with sick person AND do not have any COVID symptoms

10 days after last contact with sick person AND do not have any COVID symptoms

- You are considered a "household member" if you live in the household or stayed overnight for at least one night in a household with a sick person.
- Exclusion dates could change depending on the course of the illness and the treatment options.
- If a student is potentially exposed to COVID-19 at school or elsewhere, the student may be required to stay home from school for a period of time. In a potential exposure situation, contact tracing by the school nurse and Rock County Health Department will determine who will be excluded from school and for how long.
