

WISCONSIN ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

The basic goal of the state's Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship Program is to encourage the students to stay in Wisconsin for their postsecondary education. The District has the responsibility to select their scholarship designees with that goal in mind.

Scholarship recipients who are admitted to and enroll, on a fulltime basis, in a center or institution within the university of Wisconsin system, a technical college participating in the scholarship program, or a private institution of higher education located in Wisconsin that is participating in the program receive the award amount determined by the Higher Education Aids Board (HEAB). This scholarship is available to academic excellence scholars for up to four years (not to exceed eight semesters) provided they continue to meet academic requirements associated with the scholarship and funds are available.

Selection of the recipient of the scholarship will comply with the rules and procedures for the current scholarship year as defined by state law. A student is not eligible to receive both the Academic Excellence Scholarship and the Technical Education Excellence Scholarship and vice versa.

Only those seniors who have been enrolled in Parkview High School for the final four semesters of high school will be eligible for consideration for the academic excellence scholarship. The senior with the highest cumulative high school grade point average (GPA) rounded to as many decimal places as necessary at the end of the seventh semester (5th semester-if graduating in 3 years) will be selected as the Wisconsin Academic Excellence Scholar.

The designation of senior will be awarded to the qualifying student(s) with the highest grade point average. The senior's GPA shall be computed to as many places past the decimal point as necessary to determine a distinction between the scholars. The selection must be made by February 25th of each school year. The Board is required to make the scholar designation(s) to the HEAB as recommended by the high school faculty committee.

The following tiebreakers will be used for the State Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship:

1. First Tie Breaker - Written declaration of intent to attend a participating Wisconsin educational institution must be received by February 1st of their senior year.
2. Second Tie Breaker - Highest number of Laude points without the GPA.
3. Third Tie Breaker - ACT score must be on file at time of application. The highest composite ACT score is a determining factor.
4. Fourth Tie Breaker – Involvement in School: Extent of candidate leadership involvement in co- curricular activities. Point systems used by school co-curricular organizations or activities may be used as determining factors. 1 point awarded for each season completed of a co-curricular activity during the students' high school career.
5. Fifth Tie Breaker - If, after applying Criteria 1 through 4 above, more than one student remains eligible, the selection will be MADE BY LOT of those students remaining. Selection by lot

means that the names of students that are still tie after steps 1-4 will be placed in an opaque container. The principal will blindly remove one name in the presence of two additional certified staff members. The first name removed will be the recipient of the scholarship. The second name removed will be the first alternate. The third name will be the second alternate, etc. The names will be recorded on a record sheet in the appropriate order and the principal and two certified employees that witnessed the process need to sign and date the form. The form will be filed in the high school office with the other documents related to the academic excellence scholarship.

6. Once the recipient has been identified, all other seniors with the same grade point average (GPA) as the selected scholar shall be named as alternate scholars. If there is more than one alternate scholar with the same GPA as the selected scholar, the committee will use Tie Breakers 1-5 to determine the order of the alternate scholars.
7. If there are no seniors with the same GPA as the scholar recipient, any remaining seniors with a GPA of 3.800 or above will be selected as alternate scholars and the order of ranking will be determined using Tie Breakers 1-5. Per state law, no alternate may have less than a 3.800 GPA, or its equivalent.

PROCEDURE:

Ties will be broken in sequence of tiebreakers listed. Once a tie is broken, steps further down the sequence will not be considered. The Board is responsible for determining the State Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship recipient as recommended by the high school faculty committee.
