I believe in the power of communication and how important it is not only to keep people informed about what is going on within the school district, but also to listen to individuals and hear their thoughts and ideas about where we are and where we hope to be as the year progresses. As the school year starts, there are a few areas that I am especially interested in getting your thoughts and opinions:

Here are some ways that I have communicated with individuals in the past that I plan on continuing while in Parkview:

- 1) I prefer face-to-face meetings whenever possible. I enjoy meeting people and seeing their facial expressions and body language. I believe that when individuals or small groups of people get together that it is easier to find solutions and get to the heart of issues. During the year, I will do my best to visit school buildings and classrooms each week and to attend as many co-curricular and community events as my schedule will allow. One thing that I especially enjoy about emails is that I do not have to remember what a person may have asked me on my normal rounds and I also have a record of my responses. It is not unusual for people to ask me a host of questions as I make my way through the District and I often ask people to please send me an email, so that I do not forget their question(s). Emails also provide me an opportunity to look into situations and find out answers to your questions rather than providing a hasty answer that may not be exactly correct.

3) When topics need a more detailed explanation, I like to write articles, blogs or hold group meetings. I am also not opposed to meeting people in locations that they find more comfortable – I know that meeting inside of a school office is not always a comfortable space for all people, so if there is another location that works, I try to be flexible.

Here are some other methods of communication that I do not regularly do, but would be willing to try if it meets the needs of a number of people:

- 1) Podcasts, I have made a few podcasts in the past, but I must admit when I see or hear myself on the podcast I wonder if the person talking is really me. My mental image of myself and what I see are totally different. On a positive note, I have found podcasts useful when trying to give an electronic tour of a building or recently completed project.
- 2) Twitter, I do not currently have an account, but I am certain that one could be set up and I could learn how to use it.
