PROGRAM LOCATION - Parkview Jr/Sr High School Parkview Academy of Virtual Education

DATES - June 10th - July 3rd, 2024

TUITION

Any student seeking entrance into the Parkview School District Summer School program must reside within the established boundaries of the district. The child's parent or legal guardian must reside within Parkview School District boundaries. Non-resident students will be charged tuition in accordance with state tuition law (121.77). Non-resident students who have applied to the Board of Education by April, 2024 for the Public School Open Enrollment Program, and have been approved to enroll for the 2024-2025 school year may be waived tuition for summer school enrollment.

DAILY SCHEDULE

Time and length of classes at Parkview High School will vary. The number of weeks for each course is outlined in the course description booklet. Credit Recovery Schedule and expectations will be shared with families at the end of the school year.

TRANSPORTATION

Student transportation to and from summer school is the responsibility of a parent, guardian, or caregiver.

REGISTRATION

All students must enroll for elective courses with the appropriate teacher on or before June 3rd, 2024. Any high school student who desires to enroll in the summer school program after June 3rd, 2024 may enroll where there are still openings. It is imperative all students enroll by this date since courses are scheduled or dropped based on enrollments and the availability of qualified instructors as of this date. As a general rule, courses with an enrollment of fewer than 12 students will be canceled. Any student who does not attend Parkview schools during the regular year, must have a completed emergency form attached to their enrollment form so that school personnel can properly handle any emergency. A \$100 fee is charged for out-of-district students enrolling in summer school at Parkview.

FEES

There may be student fees charged to cover specific costs. Teachers will collect these fees on the first day of class. Please send a check payable to Parkview School District for the required amount. Credit recovery courses do not require a fee.

REGULATIONS

<u>Attendance</u> - All enrolled students are expected to attend summer school on a regular basis. Students may be excused for the following: family vacations, summer camps or clinics, illness, family emergency or absences approved by the summer school principal. However, students taking classes for credit will be expected to meet the attendance requirements of those particular classes. Because credit is given for those classes, attendance requirements are higher. A student will be dropped from a credit class upon the third (3rd) absence. Fees will not be refunded if a student drops a class or is withdrawn for attendance or disciplinary reasons. Parents must notify the appropriate building office and/or teachers if a student is to be absent.

DRESS – Regular school year rules will be followed during the summer program.

<u>**ARRIVAL**</u> – Prior to class time teachers will be busy with class preparations so student arrival should be timed accordingly.

<u>DISMISSAL</u> - Students will be expected to go home when their instructional sessions end. If students attend only one or two course sessions, they will <u>not be</u> allowed to wait a long period of time for rides or to wait for other students who are still involved in instructional activities.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT COURSE SCHEDULES

Credit recovery courses, schedules, and instructor names will be sent the week of May 27th.

COURSE CHANGES

Program course changes are discouraged since teachers are hired and classes are scheduled based on course requests. Some classes are scheduled with minimal enrollment with the expectation that all students will remain in the classes.

SUMMER SCHOOL STAFF

Certified teachers will teach all summer school programs. Efforts will be made to keep pupil-teacher ratios at a level that fosters opportunities for maximum pupil-teacher instructional interaction. When appropriate, qualified teacher aides will be hired to assist the professional staff.

*All grade level designations are based upon the student's present (2023/2024) grade in school.

CREDIT RECOVERY

Required for students grades 9 - 12 who have failed a semester or more of a required course.

Course Cost: None

Location: Parkview Academy of Virtual Education (PAVE)

Instructor: Ms. Nicole Victor

<u>Dates</u>: June 10th - July 3rd, Monday - Friday. Students will be assigned two-hour blocks of time per course taken - 8:00 - 10:00 am and/or 10:00 am - 12:00 pm.

Students will begin with one course assigned during a two-hour block. Below are the criteria for summer school. If the student does not complete the course(s), they will not be allowed to continue the course in the fall semester. The student will be placed back in the regular teacher directed course.

Criteria for summer school courses:

- 1. Student will be removed from summer school after 3 absences and no credit given.
- 2. Student must complete given assignments at the minimum of 75% accuracy before moving on to the next assignment/unit.
- 3. Students may be given additional assignments to improve academic proficiency at the discretion of the instructor.
- <u>4.</u> Students who are not compliant with summer school expectations will be removed and no credit given.
- **<u>5.</u>** Junior High students in jeopardy of retention will be contacted about what summer school courses need to be completed in order to be promoted.

OFF-SEASON ATHLETE STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Open to: Grades 7 - 12 (Incoming)

<u>Students looking to receive HS credit for this summer class will need to be in</u> <u>attendance for AT LEAST 64.5 hours of the semester. Daily attendance will be</u> <u>recorded.</u>

This course is designed for any prospective high school students that are concerned about their overall health and fitness. Students will utilize weight training, plyometrics, agility training, flexibility training, and muscular strength training. Off season athletes are *STRONGLY* encouraged to attend!

This is a <u>required</u> course for all high school band students. This course will prepare students for the upcoming pep band and marching season. Students will learn pep band music for the new season and the annual pep band trip, concepts for the homecoming show, and prepare for the fall and summer parades. Students will be fitted for uniforms during the August dates.

SUPERVISED AGRICULTURE EXPERIENCE INDEPENDENT STUDY

Open to: Grades 9 - 12

Instructor: Mr. Tjark Sattler

Course Cost: None

Dates: June 10 - August 9

Credits: <u>During this time period, students will have to log 67.5 hours to earn .5</u> <u>Agriculture Credit. Weekly Logs will be submitted to calculate hours.</u>

This course is designed to reflect one of the three essential components of an agricultural education program. This specialized course is designed for those students aspiring to further develop their Supervised Agricultural Experience. The emphasis of this course is

on hands-on learning and applying lessons to meet the needs of all students. Students in this course will work directly with the Agriculture Instructor. This independent study course includes putting together activity-based lessons relating to the SAEs of the enrolled students. Some of the areas that lessons will focus around will be: Dairy Production, Beef Production, Poultry Production, Sheep Production, Horticultural Science, Ag. Education, Agriscience Applications, Agribusiness, and many other agricultural applications students wish to pursue. Students will be required to meet with the instructor on a biweekly basis, fill out weekly work logs, and attend 8 hours of class time. All project ideas need to be approved by Mr. Sattler.

YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Open to: Grades 11 - 12

Instructor: Ms. Hannah Wellnitz

Course Cost: None

Dates: June 10 - August 31

Credits: <u>During this time period, students will have to log 67.5 hours to earn .5</u> <u>Youth Apprenticeship Credit. Weekly Logs will be submitted to calculate hours.</u>

Students registering for their junior year may apply for a junior-senior (two-year) Youth Apprenticeship (YA)program offered through the Rock County Area School-to-Work Consortium. Youth Apprenticeship programs are designed to give students more intensive study and a range of work-based learning experiences in a broad career field. Students take four semesters of YA, which are typically outside of the school day, but may also be during school day hours. At the end of their senior year, students who, 1) graduate from high school, 2) complete all four semesters of youth apprenticeship coursework, 3) perform all work-based competencies to a level of proficiency, and 4) work a minimum of 450 hours/900 hours at a work-based learning site, will earn a Wisconsin Youth Apprenticeship Occupational Proficiency Skills Certificate issued by the State of Wisconsin Governor's Work-Based Learning Board.

Students and guardians/caregivers who would like more information on the Youth Apprenticeship program, should contact Hannah Wellnitz, (608-879-2994) ext. 5101. The YA process has multiple layers, so please begin the process early in order to meet the required deadlines.

Criteria for selection:

- 1. Complete an application with references and transcripts.
- 2. Have a 96% minimum attendance record.
- 3. Have a minimum grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- 4. Accept part-time employment.

5. Comply with possible employment requests: fingerprinting, drug testing with results provided to guardians/caregivers, and/or purchase of appropriate career apparel/uniform.

6. Complete an interview with program coordinator and/or employer(s), and be accepted for employment.

7. Students must be approved (application and placement) within the first two weeks of each semester to participate. Please begin the process early.

8. Student discipline records may impact acceptance into the YA program.

The number of students selected will be open to the number of work-based learning positions available. An accepted application does not guarantee placement. Students will also be responsible for the purchase of books and other materials.
