Your responses are extremely helpful in guiding the Board of Education on this very important decision.

Here is a list of items that received at least 50% support from respondents. The majority of respondents felt these items should either be put back into the budget because of cuts made to the 2023-2024 budget and those items which should be added to the budget to provide our students with more services and educational choices:

On Monday, December 4, the Finance Committee will be reviewing and discussing each of these items. The Board of Education will also be discussing the updated results of this survey at their

December 18 Board of Education meeting. When I review the numbers, I see some areas that can probably be reduced, such as the technology budget. When the referendum failed in April, the Board of Education needed to reduce the technology budget by \$145,000. This item got a great deal of support from the survey respondents. Another survey item asked individuals whether or not they would support increasing the technology budget by \$350,000. This also got a great deal of support from the respondents. I believe these two items show a great deal of support for increasing our technology budget, but we probably don't need to have \$495.000 in our technology budget, so this number can probably be reduced.

Over the next month, each of the Board committees and the full Board will review each item and eventually make a determination on which ones they will ask the community to support. One thing that I learned from the survey results is that I need to provide a fuller explanation to each of the items, so that people know what the dollar figure represents and why the item is important for the progress of the District. So over the next several weeks, I will be going into greater detail about many of the survey items. I will also be further breaking down the survey to discuss how different groups felt about different items.

I want to again thank everyone who has already completed the operational referendum survey and to encourage those who have not yet taken the survey to do so. I believe that in working together we can arrive at the best decisions for our District.
