

STUDENT DRESS CODE

The determination of student dress and grooming shall be the responsibility of the parent or guardian, however, the Board and administrators have authority under WI law to establish rules pertaining to student conduct and dress that are needed to maintain good decorum and a favorable academic atmosphere.

Students are prohibited from wearing attire that:

- Causes, or is likely to cause, a substantial disruption of or material interference with school activities;
- Interferes with the District's educational mission or related policies; or
- Endangers the health or safety of the student or others on school premises or participating in school-sponsored activities.
- Clothing must be decent and not overly revealing. Clothing must cover private areas. Examples of clothing that would violate the dress policy would include; but not limited to, low cut shirts, strapless shirts, short skirts and short-shorts, shirts with enlarged armholes, and excessively tight clothing.

This policy applies during the school day, in school vehicles, and at school-sponsored activities.

The principal will inform staff, students and parents/guardians of this policy annually and provide for the fair and consistent enforcement of the policy.
