

DETENTION PROCEDURES

Detention is a means to carry out school discipline.

Students who received detention because of disruptive behavior, tardiness, etc. will have to make up time after school during the specified time. If a student owes more time than can be served during the detention period, the extra amount will be carried over to the next scheduled detention.

When a student is assigned detention, the parent or guardian will be notified of the reason for the detention and the day and time it is to be served. Written documentation will be kept of the reason for the detention, when contact was made with the parent/guardian and when the detention was satisfied.

Detentions are served after the school day ends unless arrangements are made in advance with the principal for an alternate time. The day and time for detention will be provided to the student/parent when the detention is assigned. Students will be given 24 hours notice prior to having to serve detention. Students will have to arrange their own transportation home from school.

Failure to serve the assigned detention will result in additional consequences ranging from additional detention assigned to in or out of school suspension.
