PUBLIC GIFTS TO THE SCHOOLS

The Board may accept and use any bequest or gift of money or property for a purpose deemed by the Board to be consistent with District goals.

To be accepted, a gift shall:

- have a purpose consistent with those of the District;
- be offered by a donor acceptable to the Board;
- place no restrictions on the District program;
- not bring "hidden" additional costs to the District;
- not be inappropriate or harmful to the best education of students;
- not imply endorsement of any business or product; or
- not be in conflict with any provisions of policy, District code or public law.

All gifts, grants and bequests will become District property and may be used at any school site. A courtesy contact will be made to the donor when a gift is moved to a different site.

The District shall not discriminate in acceptance and administration of gifts, bequests, scholarships and other aids, benefits or services to students from private agencies, organizations or persons on the basis of age, sex, race, religion, citizenship status, national origin, political affiliation, genetic information, ancestry, creed, color, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap or any other reason prohibited by state or federal law. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
