Registration: Registration will be done online. You can find the Google Registration Form on the PSD

website. Material fees can be **mailed to Parkview Elementary School, or dropped off in person at the Parkview Elementary office.** Classes will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. All students that will be in grades 1, 2, 3, or 4 during the 2024-2025 school

year are required to register for one section of Literacy Camp.

Material Fee: There may be a fee assessed for some enrichment classes to cover the cost of materials.

Please pay special attention to the Summer School Handbook and the enrichment class you are registering for to see if a material fee is assessed. (ENRICHMENT CLASS FEES

MUST BE PAID promptly after registration)

Attendance: Students are expected to attend summer school regularly. If a child will be absent from

summer school, please notify the office by calling 608-879-2956. Parents are expected to monitor their child(ren) for health symptoms and ensure their child(ren) are healthy before sending them to school. Keep students home that are ill or have been recently

exposed to COVID-19.

Attire: Students may wear casual dress that is neat and clean during summer school. However,

students must still dress appropriately for school. Beach attire is not acceptable. Students must wear shoes at all times. Tennis shoes are required if students are

enrolled in sports or outdoor type classes.

Conduct: Appropriate conduct is expected of all students. Regular school year rules and

consequences are followed during the summer school program.

Scholastic LitCamp

(STUDENTS ENTERING GRADES 1-4) 60 MINUTES

LitCamp is a summer literacy program designed for students in grades K-5. Through this course, students build social-emotional skills (belonging, curiosity, friendship, kindness, confidence, courage, and hope) by incorporating these concepts into reading and writing texts and lessons and combining them with an engaging summer camp approach. Through the integration of LitCamp, students are able to sustain their reading literacy over the summer, ultimately supporting the transition to a new school year in the fall. LitCamp's approach to reading positively influences students' reading behaviors, their attitude toward reading, and their social-emotional learning.

Enrichment Course Offerings June 10-July 03, 2024

Explore Nature (Students entering 4-6)

What better way to spend your morning than exploring the outdoors at Peace Prairie. During our time of exploration we will be going on nature walks, scavenger hunts, bug hunting, making bird feeders, and more! Also being outdoors improves mental health, boosts energy, and relieves stress! So let's take a step outdoors and find out what nature has to offer in Explore Nature! (2 hours, Limit to 12 students)

Best Day Ever! (Students entering 1-3)

Do you wish you had one more day playing your favorite PE activity? Join Ms. Best for a fun-filled summer school class where you will get another opportunity to enjoy the parachute, scooters, disco, bowling, Dance Dance Revolution, climbing wall, etc.

Team Sports (Students entering 4-6)

Team sport activities will be the focus of this course. Sports will include flag football, kickball, capture the flag, soccer, and even volleyball on rainy days.

For the Love of Wrestling

(Students entering 1-6)

Ready to have some fun and learn about wrestling? Ms. Egan will introduce you to the world of folkstyle wrestling. Want to try out wrestling but not sure if you want to sign up? This class is for beginners. Experienced wrestlers may join to work on conditioning and leadership skills. Games, drills, takedowns, escapes, pins, hygiene, and nutrition will be covered. T-shirt, shorts and socks required. No zippers, buttons or hoods. Special guests! May enroll in more than one session. Open to grades 1-5.

Beginning Recorder Class

(Students entering 3-6)

Learn to play the recorder! Students will have a great time learning to play this classic wind instrument. We will learn the first 3-5 basic notes and as many songs as possible that go along with it. Cost is \$5 for recorder or you can bring your own!

Yoga and mindfulness

(Students entering 1-3 & 4-6)

Want to get stronger, mentally and physically? Then yoga might be for you! This class is great for anyone who wants to work out and relax at the same time. Students will learn yoga moves, mindfulness, and stress management techniques everyday. Students will also participate in fun projects throughout the course. Mindfulness meditation is a great tool to use daily in and out of school! Yoga is the perfect way to get fit, have fun, and practice moving meditation!

Be Your Own Author (Students entering 4-6)

In this class we will dive into the different genres of writing, read stories from authors of this kind of writing, and practice writing in these genres. The final week or days of summer school would be the kiddos creating a mini book that is written based on one of the genres we have learned about! We will review different writing skills and conventions!

<u>Technology Tailgate</u> (Students entering 3-6)

Exploring technology is the "name of the game" in this class. Get ready to explore the world of coding, artificial intelligence and robotics! Class limited to 20 students

Makerspace 101 (Students entering 3-6)

"Steminists" needed for creative learning! If you love exploring and making all sorts of cool items out of junk and other recyclables, then makerspace 101 is for you! we'll explore the world of "making" with 3d printers as well as other tools! There is no cost for this class but students are asked to bring a bag of items from the recyclable list to fill our makerspace! Class limited to 20 students

<u>Junkyard Wars</u> (Students entering 3-6)

What can you do with a broken appliance, some recycled materials and a broken toy? Find out when you join in the learning and competition of Junkyard Wars! All participants must bring in ONE BROKEN APPLIANCE and ONE BROKEN TOY in order to participate in this class. Class limited to 20 students

Beginning Ukulele (Students entering 4-6)

This course is for those who want to learn about and how to play the Ukulele. Students will learn at least 4 basic chords and how to accompany many familiar songs. Ukuleles are provided at school.

Tech Time: Playful Adventures!

(Students entering 1-3)

Calling all young inventors and explorers! Unleash your creativity in "Tech Time: Playful Adventures!" This summer class is bursting with interactive and exciting ways for 1st and 2nd graders to discover the magic of technology. Each day will be an adventure filled with laughter, exploration, and hands-on learning. So, grab your curiosity and get ready to see what amazing things we can create together!

Technology Stem (Students entering 1-6)

Join Ms. Egan to explore the world of Technology and make it fun! We will be using STEM materials daily. (Chromebooks, iPads, legos, makerspace items, Ozobots, Dash, etc.) Learn to create word searches and crosswords puzzles. Problem solving on a daily basis. Students will have the opportunity to work on existing projects.

Quaver Creatives (Students entering 2-6)

Quaver Creatives is a class designed for students who want to learn how to make music with the technology the Quaver Music curriculum offers. Similar to GarageBand, this class will take a deep dive into the many ways to create sounds, songs and musical art. This is a much more in-depth look at Quaver Creatives than you will see during the normal school year. Final projects will be downloaded and emailed home to show parents how amazingly creative their child can be with music. School Chromebooks will be used but projects can also be accessed at home on Quaver with an internet connection.

<u>Knot Just Beads</u> (Students entering 1-6)

Students will learn basic jewelry making skills to design earrings, bracelets, and necklaces. They will also use a loom for weaving and knitting with various fibers. Finally the students will learn knots for creating bracelets and keyrings from paracord.

Needle and Thread (Students entering 3-6)

Students will learn basic hand sewing techniques and basic sewing construction skills. They will make simple projects such as tote bags, pin cushions, and decorative pillows. Possible more advanced projects include doll clothes, stuffed animals, small guilts, and more.

Fun with Music (Students entering 1-3)

Join Mrs. Schuler for some fun ways to enjoy and make music. We will sing favorite songs and learn new favorites, too! There will be musical story time and games, as well as lots of different ways to play rhythm instruments.

Road Trip Across America

(Students entering 1-3 & 4-6)

Over the course of this class, excursions to our Country's National Parks are in store for you. You will be "visiting" the different regions of "America the Beautiful", to investigate each place. Geography, a bit of history, people, and especially fun customs will be our focus for this class. Come join us on a "Road-trip Across America!"

Blazing the Trail with Technology

(Students entering 1-6)

Are you a fan of technology? If so, look no further! Join our class where we'll dive into coding robots and crafting video game levels using Bloxels and Osmo. Along the way, you'll sharpen your math, reading, and coding abilities. Limited to 20 students.

Problem Solving 101

Looking for a challenge? Join us as we learn how to solve fun and challenging problems "the Destination Imagination Way!" Students will learn valuable problem-solving skills that can be applied to daily life, classwork, and team problem-solving like the kids who participate in Destination Imagination! Current team members and interested students alike can preview the 2024-2025 team challenges in advance and prepare for an exciting season of DI!

Adventure in the Library: Unleashing the Magic of Reading and Exploration

(Students entering 1-6)

Embark on an enchanting journey in the library. Ms. Seibert and Ms. Sarah from the Orfordville Public Library are thrilled to team up to offer two dynamic adventures. Our journey kicks off with a two-week exploration of outer space, where we'll leverage various technologies, including IR books, to deepen our space journey. Following this, we'll shift our focus to the natural world, spending the next two weeks learning about animal habitats. Our exploration will be enriched by visits to the Peace Prairie and/or weekly walking field trips, bringing the pages of our books to life in the great outdoors. Class is limited to 20 students.

Theatre Fun (Students entering 1-3)

The best part of Halloween, besides the candy, is getting to pretend to be someone else. In this course, that fun never ends! Students will explore the basics of voice, characterization, body language, and storytelling through fun games and activities. Students will also get to create fantastical characters and their characters' worlds by crafting masks, props, and sets. The last few days of summer school, students will get to perform a skit for their family and friends.

Intro to Theatre (Students entering 4-6)

In this course, students will learn theatre and performance basics by playing improv games, examining mime techniques, and diving into character development. Students will also explore the art of storytelling through body movement and choreographed scenes. Playing fun theatre games will help students build confidence in speaking and performing in front of others.

Kindergarten Readiness

Open to <u>ANY</u> child that is <u>age eligible (5 years of age by September 1st) to enter Kindergarten in the fall of 2024.</u>

- This is a great opportunity for your child to get acclimated to a longer day at school (4 hours) each day.
- Meet "new" friends that may be in their classrooms in September.
- For those who attended PES's 4K program it will be a nice "refresher" on school expectations and for our "NEW" friends a nice way to learn our routines and rules before the first day of school.
- During our time together we will work on art, singing, dancing, stories, have breakfast break together, play outside, and many other FUN activities each day including:

Social skills (getting along with others).

Fine motor skills (writing, cutting, & drawing

Pre-Reading and Math foundational skills.

Junior Golf \$15.00 fee

(Students entering 1-6)

The Parkview Summer School Junior Golf Program is a great way to learn the game of golf. Participants will learn the basic fundamentals of the golf swing, as well as rules and etiquette as they play a few holes after each lesson. (Participants must have their <u>own clubs</u> and be prepared to walk (play) a few holes <u>after</u> lessons.)

The lessons will take place at the Bass Creek Driving Range. We will also attempt to play a few holes each day depending on public/league use.

Please have your child prepared for all types of weather conditions. We recommend having a bottle of water, sports drink, snack, sunscreen, and a hat or visor. (Some water and snacks will be provided with fee funds.) Regardless of the weather, always assume we are having golf. We will still go as scheduled.

In the event of bad weather, we may meet in the big room at Bass Creek, or if possible, in the HS Gym depending on availability. We will do written work or video study of the game of golf's history, etiquette, and state of the game today.
